

Just How Big Are Whales?

Materials:

100 foot rope, marked off in one foot increments. You can combine two or three smaller lengths to achieve the full length of 100 feet.

Objective:

Gain a sense of scale as you compare different species of whales to everyday items.

Guiding Questions:

How big are whales?

How does the size of different whales compare with the size of common objects? Cetaceans (whales, dolphins and porpoises) range in size from slightly smaller than 6 ft (1.8m) to 100 ft (30m). There are 88 species in all. This activity will help you get a sense of the variety of sizes in this group of aquatic mammals.

Procedure

- 1. Mark the rope in one foot increments. To save time you could mark therope every five or ten feet. We suggest making a double line for each tenfoot increment.
- 2. Find a place (you may have to outside) where you can extend the rope to its full length. Using the table on the next page for reference, place a book, ahat, a stick or some other object at the measurements along the rope thatmatch up with the animals on the table.
- 3 Measure yourself. Calculate how many of you it would take to equal thelengths of the whales listed in the table. Write those numbers in.
- 4. Look up the length of other objects, such as a school bus, your car, yourfavorite shirt, another animal, and calculate how many of that object itwould take to equal the length of each of the whales.
- 5. Working in reverse, walk one end of the rope to the other end so that it isnow half as long. What species does this represent?
- 6. Fold the rope in half again. Which species is this length?
- 7. Fold the rope in half once more. You should now be at a length of 12.5 feet. What animal, or animals, does this represent?


